The retina is the light sensitive portion of the back of your eye that allows you to see. Our clinic was handpicked to receive the latest OPTOS technology, making us one of only a handful of offices in United States where this new level of retinal mapping is available. It is our commitment to provide the best in state of the art eye care to you.

Eye diseases like glaucoma and macular degeneration and body diseases like diabetes and high blood pressure can damage the sensitive structures in your eyes. Many times eye damage is occurring but you have no symptoms for years. Eye damage may be preventable if treated and managed correctly. Documentation with retinal photography assists in disease management.

In addition, retinal photography may eliminate the need for dilation. Photographs of the macula, optic nerve and outer most portions of your retina give your doctor the same view as dilation does. Outer retinal photography is NEW and more thorough. Some patients see dilation as inconvenient. You now have the option of having dilation or retinal photography. If your doctor finds anything that needs further attention, you may need to be dilated.

Dr. Carroll, Dr. Wells and Dr. LaHiff highly recommend a retinal photography screening exam as part of your eye examination for documentation.

Vision insurance plans provide you with basic vision examination coverage, but do not include advanced disease detection procedures like retinal photography. The fee for this extended exam is only \$46 and is due at the time of service.
